Certification Report

To the Board of Directors and Management of Boise Cascade, L.L.C.

We have completed our assessment of management's assertion, set out in the attached letter, that Boise Cascade, L.L.C. has met the requirements of the Sustainable Forestry Initiative[®] (SFI) Program Annex 2 Chain of Custody Standard and the Programme for the Endorsement of Forest Certification Schemes (PEFC) Annex 4: Chain of Custody of Forest Based Products – Requirements (the "Standards") as of September 7, 2007 for the All Joist Building Products manufacturing facility (the "Facility"). Management is responsible for ensuring the Facility meets the requirements of the Standards. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on management's assertion that the Facility met these requirements, based on our assessment. Furthermore, our tests of the operating effectiveness of the specific controls were as of September 12, 2007. The projection of any conclusions, based on our findings, to future periods is subject to the risk that changes may alter the validity of such conclusions.

Our assessment was conducted in accordance with the ISO 19011:2002 management system auditing standard and, accordingly, included examining, on a sample basis, evidence supporting management's assertion, evaluating on an overall basis whether the requirements were met, and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We planned and performed our work in order to obtain reasonable, rather than absolute, assurance with respect to the information examined. We believe our work provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, the Chain of Custody process, including objectives and control procedures for the Facility, was suitably designed to provide reasonable assurance that the requirements of the Standards were met, in all material respects, and that the Chain of Custody process and control procedures operated effectively as of September 7, 2007.
